Problem Statement Shortage of Affordable



The **Hampton Redevelopment and Housing Authority** (HRHA),

Hampton, Virginia needs to serve:


- People with <u>low income</u> who need affordable housing
- Many people who are <u>out of</u> work with no income
- 1,000 people on the waiting list to get housing

Solution: Participation in the Move-to-Work program that allows HRHA to help families achieve self-sufficiency.

Policy Context

Assessment of families being served by HRHA

- Measure their capacity for independent living
- Connect them with the services that can facilitate their progress toward self-sufficiency





Policy Formation Move-to-Work Program



Three **Primary Goals** of the **Move-to- Work (MTW) Program**

- Reduce cost and achieve greater cost efficiency in Federal expenditures
- Give <u>incentives to families with</u> <u>children</u> where the head of household is working, is seeking work, or is preparing for work
- Increase housing choices for lowincome families

Policy Formation Move-to-Work Survey




Move-to-Work Survey Instrument

To gather information on an array of variables which address many components of self-sufficiency.



Policy Analysis Shortage of Affordable Housing

- Low-income
 Virginians are paying
 too much for their
 housing
- More than 80% of extremely lowincome and very lowincome households are housing "costburdened".



Policy Implications Reducing Evictions



Changes to laws to help **reduce evictions** and lessen the impact of evictions on affected households:

- Requiring written leases
- Putting a cap on late fees
- Requiring eviction orders to be expunged from records if the case is later dismissed

Support policies to fund the **Move-to-Work Program**

Recommendations for HRHA



- 1. Use the Move-to-Work survey data to learn about the needs of its residents
- 2. Offer needed resources to help low-income families achieve self-sufficiency
- 3. <u>Support families</u> as they move from public housing to other housing options
