




Increased economic independence through an alternative national currency other than CFA Franc

Many coups have happened in African countries fighting the French control over the country.








Policy Implications





Greater autonomy leads to increased sovereignty of la Françafrique

Separating from France may lead to increased economic & regional stability among the CFA

Decolonization changes international relations between the CFA & other global powers

Recommendations

- Economic Diversification: encourage economic partnerships beyond France to reduce dependency or fund industries besides the cocoa industry.
- Monetary Independence: transition away from CFA franc towards a nationality controlled currency system.
- Cultural Preservation: promote local languages and cultural heritage though education and media.
