

### **Problem Statement**

WHY SHOULD YOU CARE? WHAT IS THE PROBLEM?

Coal dust pollution from nearby export terminals has plagued communities in Hampton Roads and Newport News in Southeast Virginia since the 1980s. This airborne dust poses health risks, challenges environmental regulations, and disproportionately impacts residents living near the terminals. The current transportation and storage methods for coal, using open rail cars and stockpiles, are the root cause of this issue.




Timeline: 1980s\* - Now

### O1 Health Concerns

- Respiratory problems: Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) and black lung disease.
- Studies link coal dust exposure to heart disease, certain cancers, and developmental problems in children.
- **02** Economic Concerns
  - Decreased property values, reduced enjoyment of public areas, and business impacts.
- 03 Environmental Concerns
  - Air pollution, water pollution, and soil contamination.




" [My sister's] diagnosis was a coal miner's lung so they had to amputate it for her to have a healthy life."



# **Policy Formation**

- Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA) Regulations: Protects
  workers from coal dust exposure through safety standards and
  monitoring.
- Energy Policy Act of 2005: Promotes clean coal technologies, research into carbon capture to reduce coal dust emissions.
- State Legislation and Community Advocacy: States enact laws; advocacy for stricter regulations and legal action.
- EPA: 2020: Stricter Coal Dust Transportation Regulations
- NASA PurpleAir Machines: monitor air quality, including PM 2.5 particles.
- Sierra Club: Pushing EPA to regulate uncovered train cars that carry coal

### Challenges:

Monitoring gaps in affected communities (17 monitoring devices in VA) PurpleAir machines only record PM 2.5 particles, which are too small to capture coal dust particles.

Distance limitations (e.g., 60 miles) between monitors and communities

\*EPA 2020 Update does not affect older facilities such as Kinder Morgan Terminal

# Policy Analysis

Disadvantages of existing legislative and regulatory structures:

- Inadequate enforcement measures
- Inconsistent administration
- Lack of reporting and monitoring systems
  - Difficulty in determining extent of issue







How to make Hampton Virginia a safer and cleaner place:




- Educate residents about the health risks
