CURRICULUM

Our participant-centered approach to learning offers a rich curriculum including lectures, case studies, practical and hands-on activities, group projects, and workshops that enhance research, critical thinking, and writing skills.

The Summer Academy Online is a full-time two-week program June 26- July 9, 2022.

Course hours are equivalent to a standard 15-week semester course. Attendance in all program activities is required for the awarding of a certificate of completion. All course content is delivered remotely.

STATEMENT OF INTEREST
To state why you are applying in your own words: include your interests, academic work, and community involvement.



TRANSCRIPTS
To verify academic enrollment. Standardized test scores are not required.
